ID- AYU0209) for intake capacity with 42 seats (53 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- 1. It is pertinent to mention here that conditional permission after 1st appeal to take admission with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the A.Y 2022-23 was issued to you on the basis of affidavit no. 280521 vide reference no. HFW-AYUR-AYURM-0096-2022-26506/H dated 22.11.2022 submitted by the Commissioner-Cum-Secretary to Govt., Health and Family Welfare Department, Govt. of Odisha at the time of first appeal filed by you to the Commission, NCISM for issuance of conditional permission for the academic year 2022-2023.
- 2. Further, in reference to your application vide ref. no. 172/KATS dated 25.01.2023, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely Kaviraj Ananta Tripathy Sharma Ayurvedic College & Hospital, At/Post-Ankushpur, Via-Kukudakihandi, Dist.-Ganjam,-761100, Odisha (Inst. ID- AYU0209) for issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats from the academic session 2023-24, visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent on 27.03.2023 & 28.03.2023 through hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and Letter of Intent (LoI) has been issued to your college vide letter of even no. dated 22.05.2023 for issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.
- 3. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Kaviraj Ananta Tripathy Sharma Ayurvedic College & Hospital, At/Post-Ankushpur, Via-Kukudakihandi, Dist.-Ganjam,-761100, Odisha (Inst. ID- AYU0209) inspection of your College was conducted on 12.06.2023 and 13.06.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- 4. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

1. Teaching Pharmacy:-

a) Quality Testing Lab is not available.

2. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of Conditional permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course is $\frac{Available}{Required} x100\% = \frac{21}{30} x100\% = 70\%$ (Excluding Excess and considering visitor observation report).

Functionality of the hospital –

- a) There were 0 deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2022 to 31st Dec 2022. Labor room is non functional.
- 4. Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments availability is 52.78%.

Observation by the visitors:-

- a) Hospital does not possess centralized computer facilities.
- No sign boards on Panchakarma procedure rooms and no proper compartments for Panchakarma procedures
- Procedure rooms are congested and less instrument seen and temporary board seen in many departments.
- d) A separate EYE and ENT OPD are not there.
- e) Shalakya OT not found separate shalkaya kriya kalpa procedure room not found.
- f) Nursing counter is not found in each ward.
- 5. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 49th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 27.07.2023. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 27.07.2023 to appear on 02.08.2023 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.
- 6. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide 1554/KATS dated 02.08.2023 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Dr. Bipin Bihari Khuntia, Principal on behalf of college appeared before the Hearing Committee on 27.07.2023 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college, The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

In view of MSR 2016, the submission is not considered and hence shortcoming of one higher faculty persist.

The principal has submitted that Dr. Surya Narayan Rath is working as Sanskrit teacher on part time basis.

The committee observed that the faculties namely Dr. Siba Prasad Rout (AYDG00793), Dr. Anshuman Biswal (AYDG00152), Dr. Satabdi Satarupa Patnaik, Dr. Jitendra KumarAcharya, Dr. Niroj Kumar Mirdha has been deployed as lecturer from the post of AMO.

In view of MSR 2016, the submission is not considered and hence shortcoming of one higher faculty persist.

The Principal has submitted that **Kayachikitsa**, Dr. Nibedita Mohapatra (TC-AYKC01447) is joined as Reader on 02.11.2022 vide Govt. of Odisha Health & F.W. dept. Notification No. 24581, Dt. 01.11.2022.In this regard committee verified Part1 & 2

and it is observed that the faculty has already been considered during assessment by NCISM. The Principal has again submitted that appointment of 01 Professor in Kayachikitsa

In view of the above, submission is not considered and hence shortcoming persist.

7. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 50th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 03.08.2023.

WHEREAS, in view of the shortcoming and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college is fulfilling the <u>basic eligibility criteria for</u> issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats and not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) for UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24 on the basis of the condition that the college shall fulfill the deficiencies as mentioned in the observation of Hearing Committee in above paras by 31st December 2023-

"For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule–V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 50th Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 21 total eligible Teaching faculty excluding excess staff and additional staff for PG course.

There is deficiency of 06 teachers for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity. Therefore, after applying the seat Reduction Policy college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 42 seats (53 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 42 seats (53 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.

- 8. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, Conditional Permission is granted to Kaviraj Ananta Tripathy Sharma Ayurvedic College & Hospital, At/Post-Ankushpur, Via-Kukudakihandi, Dist.-Ganjam,-761100, Odisha (Inst. ID- AYU0209) with 42 seats (53 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of LOP to start 01 New PG course in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under for the academic session 2023-24.
 - (i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 42 seats (53 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] and 15% of postgraduate seats of 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) in 01 PG course seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- 8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:
